HEAD OF PRIMARY MESSAGE

When visiting classes throughout the week, I am always impressed to see our students use an array of new and interesting words when speaking and writing. A child's vocabulary, or the amount of words they are able to understand, speak and write is an important indicator of literacy success. Reading is more than verbalising a text, it involves the complex task of comprehending the written word. This becomes extremely challenging if words are not understood. The task of writing is highly complex as it requires children to transform their ideas into a written text. Possessing an extensive vocabulary not only makes the writing process easier for a student but also allows them to create pieces of writing that are both interesting and engaging for the reader. By encouraging students to develop their vocabulary, we are enabling them to not only enjoy reading and writing but also feel a degree of success when undertaking such tasks.

An effective way that parents can assist in broadening their child's vocabulary is to encourage them to read books, magazines or articles that are directly related to their areas of interest. If your child displays an interest in sport, music, cars or space for example, buy or borrow reading material that allows them to expand their knowledge and vocabulary about that particular topic. Use their topic of interest in your daily conversations at the dinner table or on your way to school so that they get the opportunity to share their knowledge and use new vocabulary learnt. Learning new words can be fun, even for adults.

Today we celebrated a beautiful mass prepared by Sr Cynthia and the Year 3 teachers. It was a wonderful celebration ending with a lovely reflection by the students. Thank you also to Mr Wood and Mrs Sassine for preparing the choir who sang so exquisitely throughout the mass.



Learning Centre News

The Primary Learning Centre is always a hive of activity and this week has been no exception. On Monday we received a special delivery of some 'Living Eggs'. These eggs are part of the Year 2 Science program which involves the students learning all about life cycles. Each day the students have been able to observe and discuss the necessary requirements for the eggs to hatch, the changes that they have seen in the eggs and the developmental stages of a chicken's growth including what they need to survive. It is also an opportunity for our young students to develop their analytical and data collecting skills as outlined in the Science Syllabus. Students and teachers from other grades have also benefitted from the excitement of our new fluffy friends.

Activities like these are not only an enjoyable learning experience but also allow our older students to demonstrate their leadership skills. Library borrowing is an important part of a child's wider reading experience. Students are able to borrow a range of fiction, non-fiction, picture books and chapter books and there are always new books being added to our collection. To entice students to borrow, Mrs LeMerle has randomly placed six Golden Tickets in a range of library books. If your child finds a ticket in their book, all they need to do is write a short summary about the book and they will win a prize. I ask that if your child has any overdue library books they be returned so that other students have the opportunity to borrow them.

Year 3 Experiments

Last Friday, students from Year 3 conducted experiments as part of their Science unit, Material World. They were able to investigate the effects of adding or removing heat to a variety of solids and liquids. Students thoroughly enjoyed this hands-on learning experience.
