MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL – Sr Margaret Ghosn

As we continue on with providing the best education for our students I need to remind parents of a few matters:

- Naplan unfortunately there are parents who are stating that MCHF is charging for Naplan when no
 other school pays. This is incorrect. All non-public schools must pay for Naplan. Please refrain from
 smearing the College name by making false claims such as the College is collecting the money to fund
 the new building project! It would be appreciated if parents focussed on assisting their children to
 perform to the best of their ability in Naplan, rather than gossiping negatively about the College
- Procedure for Applying for Leave (family holidays) In line with the College 'Student Attendance Policy' and current legislation, families wishing to apply for leave, 10 to 100 school days, must follow the procedure whereby: 1) Four weeks prior to departure, must complete the 'Application for Extended Leave' and provide supporting documents. 2) The Application is reviewed in consultation with the Principal. 3) If approved, a letter will be issued to the parents. 4) Prior to the student's leave, the College will provide two weeks of work for each Key Learning Area. 5) If the College Principal denies the request for leave, the parents will be notified in writing. Unfortunately parents are not giving the school sufficient notice of the leave OR are notifying the school after booking flights with leave being taken in the middle of exams or after the school holidays. We kindly remind you that Parents MUST notify the College FOUR WEEKS before departure AND prior to booking the flights so together we can negotiate the best time for leave. We understand that sometimes dates may not be flexible but with greater time and discussion, we will be able to reach the best outcome for your child's education.
- Canteen money There are parents who are providing \$10 or more every day for their children to purchase at the canteen. This is your choice but please keep in mind that Primary students are not always well informed on how much money to spend. Furthermore other parents feel the pressure to provide their children with extra money when the budget doesn't allow for it. Please be moderate with the amount of money you give your children on a daily basis.
