NRMA Science & Road Safety Day on Tues 13th June - will involve the students participating in a live show in the Primary hall. The show combines road safety with science, covering messages including the importance of wearing a helmet and fastening your seatbelt. The science component demonstrates the impact of the forces experienced on the body should an incident occur. We hope to see many parents there. Rules at the Crossing:

- There is NO RUNNING allowed on the crossing at any time YOU MUST WALK this is a safety issue in case someone falls over and hurts themselves or knocks into other people while crossing.
- You must wait until the School Crossing Supervisor has the stop sign raised and has given you the ok to proceed to cross.
- When the School Crossing Supervisor has given you the direction to proceed you MUST proceed -Do not give directions to School Crossing Supervisor on when you are ready to cross. If you are not ready to cross then move away from the crossing.
- School Crossing Supervisor is appointed by the Roads and Maritime services to keep the crossing safe during morning & afternoon peak times. Respect & courtesy is appreciated.

MCHF Phone App - Our College has our own Skoolbag iPhone and Android App to communicate more effectively with our Parent/Student community. To install, search for our College name *Maronite College of the Holy Family* in the Apple App Store or Google Play Store. The App has the ability to sort and filter the notifications you receive. To turn these filters on follow these steps:

- Go to your App
- Click on the 3 dots labelled "More" (Bottom right hand side of App)
- Click "Setup Push Notifications"
- Tap the "ON" tab beside the category that is applicable to you.

Parent Portal - The portal is a web based system which allows parents to log in and view their child's details, records and other information and features such as student reports, booking parent/teacher meetings online and subject selection in Secondary. Parents/Guardians have the option to change and edit their child's details – however changes need to be verified by the College. The portal link can be accessed via the College website under the *Parents/Guardians* tab. Login details for the parent portal are also now available. There are two ways parents can receive their login details:

- 1. Collect the log in details slip from the Main Administration. If a parent is unable to collect the slip, your child is permitted to collect the slip on your behalf only with a signed letter by the parent/guardian.
- 2. Email Mr Elie Asmar at <u>easmar@mchf.nsw.edu.au</u> for the login details to be sent to you via email.
