HEAD OF PRIMARY MESSAGE

At this week's Professional Learning Meeting, all Primary teachers were asked to complete a writing task whereby they had to view a stimulus picture and construct an imaginative text. No group discussion or collaboration with peers was allowed and a time limit was placed upon them. The reason for this exercise was for teachers to understand and analyse their own thought process and writing style. The same Writing Stimulus was then given to all students from Kindergarten to Year 6 during class. They were asked to construct a text based on their thoughts about the picture. This type of writing experience allows children to not only express their creativity, but more importantly demonstrate their acquired writing skills.



From each student's written text, teachers were able to assess aspects of writing development and identify individual writing goals. Both teachers and students enjoyed the writing experience. Students were surprised that teachers also completed the task and loved hearing the stories they had written.

Transfiguration/MacKillop Mass

Mobile Devices at School
