HEAD OF PRIMARY MESSAGE

Welcome back to what will be yet another busy but exciting term ahead. I hope that you all had an enjoyable break with your family. Term 4 is always fast paced and intense in nature. For teachers, it is their last opportunity to ensure that their students' learning is consolidated in readiness for next year. At school, it is vital that we encourage all students to remain focused on their learning and try their best at all times. The teacher's job is not complete until the last day of term when all that could be done to assist the development of their students has been implemented. I ask that as parents, you also ensure your child displays a committed work ethic at home by completing their set homework and daily reading. Working together and supporting each other in partnership, will ensure the best opportunity for educational growth to occur in all of our students.

Daily Reading

As teachers, we are always encouraging students to read. Reading not only allows learning of information, but it opens up the mind to a world of creativity and imagination. When we read, we develop an understanding of writing techniques and vocabulary. If a student reads for at least 20 minutes a day at home, they will hear 1.8 million words per year. By the time a student is in Year 6 they will have read for 851 hours. Research has also shown that they are likely to score better than 90% of their peers in standardised tests.

Professional Learning

As educators, we continually partake in professional learning experiences in order to enhance our knowledge and skills. On Monday, all staff from MCHF and St Maroun's College participated in a Professional Development Day which focused on student engagement. Dr Rich Allen presented a variety of strategies designed to actively engage students in the classroom thus making them eager to learn and develop their understanding about a topic. Teachers not only enjoyed the day, but walked away with many ideas that they can't wait to try with their students.



Stage 3 Touch Football Gala Day



Welcome back to Term 4. I hope the term break provided an opportunity to rest, freshen up and prepare for what will be a short but very busy term which will include exams, reporting, induction of the College leaders and annual expo preparation. Uniform and Grooming

A reminder that students must be in summer uniform this term. Jumpers may be worn should there be any cold weather. A reminder that all students must continue to adhere to the College's grooming policy. Some students have already been addressed and were reminded of the College's expectations.

Mobile Phone Policy Changes

The College Executive team has reached a decision to amend the K-12 Mobile Phone Policy. Therefore, beginning of 2020, MCHF will become a mobile free College for all students, this includes mobile phones and all types of smart watches. As the College already has a BYOD Policy, we believe that the students have adequate access to technology and there is no significant need for them to access and use their mobile phones during the school day. This term, we will begin educating the students about the new K-12 Mobile Phone Policy in order to achieve a successful transition by the beginning of the 2020 school year. This will mean that:

- Students are not permitted to access or use any mobile phone or smart watch during College hours.
- Students who need to access or use a mobile phone or smart watch during College hours must be supervised by an authorised staff member
- Students who access or use a mobile phone or smart watch without permission, will be disciplined in accordance to the Discipline Policy, which is outlined in the College Student Development Policy.
- The College will no longer collect and store any mobile phone or smart watch during the day for safe keeping.
- The College will take NO responsibility for any damaged, lost or broken mobile phones or smart watches.

Year 11 Leadership Camp




Principal's Award -

Year 4 students reading with Kindy Rose students. They love reading books together in the Learning Centre.



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
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
