This year, Maronite Family of the Holy Family are once again supporting the St Vincent de Paul Society's Annual Christmas Appeal. It is difficult for us to imagine what it would be like to not have enough food to eat each day, but this is the reality for many. In Australia, one in six

children live in poverty and one in every five don't have enough food to eat on a daily basis. Raising student awareness of the hardships others face is vital so that they can truly understand how they can make a difference to someone's life.

Already this week, class teachers have been discussing the Vinnies Christmas Appeal with their students. Yesterday a note was sent home listing a range of possible hamper items that could be donated. Once collected, the hampers will be delivered by St Vincent de Paul to families in our community who need support and assistance, so that they too can have a joyous Christmas. Pet Incursion

This week, students from Kindergarten to Year 2 were involved in an incursion all about Responsible Pet Ownership. The NSW Government has developed this extremely worthwhile program which they deliver free of charge to primary schools throughout the state. The program has been designed to educate young children on what it means to be a responsible pet owner and how to live safely with dogs. The session was presented by specially trained pet educators who are allowed to bring their suitability-tested dog with them to help spread their message. The presentation used a range of



multimedia tools and engaged our students through the use of role play, songs and story-telling. Both the students and teachers enjoyed themselves immensely and learnt many important safety skills in the process.

Band Performance

At Thursday morning's assembly, the primary classes were entertained by Mr Wood and the 'Fabulous Five'. Although nervous before their performance, Charbel Francis, Joseph Daher, Christian Kabalan, John Yaacoub and James Akoury strummed their guitars in time to play three beautiful songs. Story Time in the Learning Centre

Every day during Break 2, the Learning Centre becomes a hive of activity. Students buzz around like bees completing research tasks on the computer, playing board games with their friends or just simply enjoying the company of a good book. One activity that has become a favourite of the younger students in particular, is Story Time which is led by some Year 6 students. This week Olivia Bechara and Kayla Daher read a story to a group of Year 2 students. This type of interaction between our students not only assists in developing a love of reading and their literacy skills, but also reinforces the importance of building positive relationships in our school community.



Library Borrowing

Library borrowing will cease for Year 6 students next Monday 11th November. For all other students in Kindergarten to Year 5, borrowing will finish on Friday 15th November. Year 5 Mathematics

In Ms Kartabani's Mathematics class this week, the students have been learning all about measurement. In one of their tasks, they had to plan, design and produce a form of packaging for lollies that totalled a gross mass of 65 grams. Students were thoroughly engaged in the lesson and worked collaboratively to produce their final product. They also enjoyed eating the lollies at the end. What a 'sweet' lesson it was!

Year 6 Mathematics

Students from 6 Indigo have been learning about the Cartesian Plane which was





named after the French mathematician Rene Descartes. Students mapped out the Cartesian Plane and the four quadrants to assist them in visualising and applying this abstract concept to their mathematical thinking. This lesson was truly 'off the grid'.

School Bus

Of late, there have been increasing issues regarding student travel on the afternoon buses. The College has been asked to remind all students who catch a bus, that they are required use an Opal Card to tap on and tap off. The main reason for this, is that the Opal Card assists the

bus companies in collecting data about the number of students who catch the bus and the route that is needed to ensure they get to their destination safely. When students fail to have an Opal Card or use one with no credit, it means that the bus company believes there to be fewer people on the bus than there actually is. At the end of last term, this information resulted in the cancellation of a bus, making two buses combine. I urge all parents to ensure their child has their Opal Card with them each day so that the College can be provided with required bus services.

Swimming Carnival

A reminder that our Primary Swimming Carnival will be held next Thursday 14th November 2019 at Auburn Ruth Everuss Aquatic Centre. Students from Years 3-6 will be attending and are encouraged to participate in any of the races available to them. 
THIS AND THAT

Year 3 Orange have written and illustrated their own picture books and Kindy Rose are lucky enough to have the stories read to them by the authors themselves!








Year 5 are learning about Living Things and their survival in Science. Students were required to plan and conduct a fair test to show the conditions needed for a particular plant to grow and survive in its environment. Year 5 discussed the need of sun, water, air and soil to grow a plant. To test this theory, students conducted an experiment where they had six different plants growing in six different environments; in the sun, in the cupboard, in soil, in cotton, with access to air and with no access to air. Students are enjoying watching their plants grow and observing the differences in the growth. - Ms K. Kartabani
