We wish them a much earned rest after the stress and studies of the past few weeks.


Today we extend our congratulations to all the students in Year 3 as they had their

Remembrance Day in Australia commemorates the sacrifices of men and women during times of war. At the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, one minute of silence is observed across the country to mark the final moment of the First World War when the guns on the Western Front fell silent. This day was originally known as Armistice Day. It was a day people stopped to recognise and honour the brave soldiers who fought for peace. Primary Staff and students commemorated this day with a moving ceremony that was dedicated to all those who had fought for our country in an effort to protect it from harm. Students reflected on the significance of this day by

remembering all of the men and women of the Australian Defence Force who made the ultimate sacrifice for the freedom we share today. *We will remember them.*

First Reconciliation

Today our Year 3 students received the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. They have been preparing for this day by developing a true understanding that reconciliation is a celebration of God's gift of forgiveness. PARENT CORNER

With the School holidays fast approaching please remember to follow the 5 simple steps for sun safety -


- 1. Slip on sun protective clothing that covers as much of your body as possible.
- 2. Slop on SPF 30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen, at least 20 minutes before sun exposure. Reapply every two hours when outdoors or more often if perspiring or swimming.
- 3. Slap on a broad-brimmed hat that shades your face, neck and ears.
- 4. Seek shade.
- 5. Slide on sunglasses.
