Changes to Applications for Approved Leave - Travel

From the beginning of 2020, any student intending to take leave for a period of 5 days or more during the school term, must complete an application form in order to obtain Principal approval.

Opal Cards

All students who travel to and/or from school on a bus must hold a current Opal Card.

Students are required to use their Opal Cards to 'tap on' and 'tap off' when boarding and disembarking any school bus they catch in the course of their journey. Opal Card data gathered when students 'tap on' and 'tap





off', is used to determine the demand for bus services. If students do not 'tap on' and 'tap off', the data collected will be inaccurate and could lead to bus services being cancelled.

Lost Property

There is a large amount of lost property accumulating in tubs outside the Primary Office and on the Primary Playground. If you have lost any item of clothing, please check to see if it is in either tub. All lost property will be cleared at the end of next week.

Results: Less than 60% in Examinations

In order to continue to improve the results and post school opportunities of your child, it is imperative that students work towards achieving a minimum of 60% (Band 3) in their examinations. Continued poor performance in Stage 4 and Stage 5 has a detrimental effect on results in Stage 6, as poor study habits and work ethic have been established. Please note, poor performance due to lack of consistent effort will not be tolerated and may put your child's enrolment into Stage 6 in jeopardy. Further to this, should the need arise, your child may be placed on an Academic Management Plan to assist them in improving their results. In addition, if your child, in Stage 6, is achieving less than the minimum, their HSC results will be in jeopardy and they will be required to be placed on an Academic Management Plan. If you have any questions or would like anything clarified, please do not hesitate to contact the Director of Curriculum, Ms Dalla, at the College.

Awards Ceremony

Our Annual Awards Ceremony will be held on Friday 6th December 2019 at 11:30am in the Secondary Hall. Students receiving awards will be receiving an invitation for their parents/guardians this week to attend the ceremony. A reminder that all students must be in full College uniform for this ceremony.

Year 10 Taster Lessons

Year 10 students completed their taster lessons this week. It was an opportunity for students to get a 'taste' of what the courses would be like in senior years. There were a range of activities, even guest presenters, held during the week. Visual Arts students got to experience elements of the course through an introduction to the Stage 6 Syllabus, theoretical expectations, and Artist Practice; which was complemented with a Workshop held by Adriana Abi-Rizk from Art Scene in West Ryde. Students were experimenting with a range of materials and were highly engaged in learning about how they can extend their personal material practices. Overall the week was a great success and we thank Ms Dalla for implementing this initiative and to the Year 11, 2020 teachers for preparing the sessions for the students.

Changes to Applications for Approved Leave – Travel

Commencing from 2020, the minimum days to apply for approved leave – travel has changed to 5 days instead of 10 days. Any student who wishes to apply for approved leave – travel for 5 days or more commencing in 2020 must complete an application form.

Parramatta City Council's Young Women's Workshop

There are many pressures that young girls face today. On Wednesday 27th November 2019, selected year 10 students participated in a workshop for young women, together with students from surrounding schools. The workshop focused on wellbeing and how to keep themselves and their friends safe and happy.

Forensic Science Incursion Monday 25th November

On Monday 25th November 2019, the students of Year 9 became forensic investigators for the day. A forensic scientist presented a crime scene that



occurred in Sydney many years ago. She brought with her several pieces of equipment and reports from the investigation of this crime scene and explained to the students how scientists gather and analyse evidence and present it to the police in order to solve the crime and make arrests. The students were given the task to use the equipment and read the information provided to gather their evidence. From this they were able to work out who committed the crime and why. Many of the students were clever enough to reach the correct conclusion. They discussed their findings with the presenter and role-played the events that led to the crime. This incursion gave the students a taste of a career in science that is both interesting and worthwhile. Hopefully, it inspires some students to study and work in the field. 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


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


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PARENT CORNER


