#### **End of Year Reports**

Student reports will be released to parents on Friday 13th December 2019 via the Parent Portal. These reports capture student learning for the second semester and inform parents about their child's progress for the year. Reports are a significant communication between school and home. Teachers have the responsibility to honestly inform parents about student learning measured against syllabus outcomes. Teachers can only report on what students demonstrate. This can be challenging for some parents who may see different skills displayed at home or in other extracurricular activities. Teachers cannot account for learning that is not demonstrated by a student in the school setting. Student achievement is reported on an A - E scale. It is important to recognise that every student is different and that they cannot all achieve an 'A' or a 'B'. In fact, receiving such grades is rare and celebrating individual student growth is far more important and should be acknowledged. Being awarded a 'C' grade means that a student has achieved set outcomes and is where they need to be in regards to

learning. Such grades can reflect a lot of hard work on a student's behalf and if they have applied maximum effort, no one can ask for more. It is important that students have a positive disposition to learning and parents play a key role in this. Your response to your child's grades can make a significant difference to a student's future learning.

#### **Opal Cards**

All students who travel to and/or from school on a bus must hold a current Opal Card. Students are required to use their Opal Cards to 'tap on' and 'tap off' when boarding and disembarking any school bus they catch in the course of their journey. Opal Card data gathered when students 'tap on' and 'tap off', is used to determine the demand for bus services. If students do not 'tap on' and 'tap off', the data collected will be inaccurate and could lead to bus services being cancelled. If your child will be catching the bus in 2020, please ensure that they have a valid Opal Card prior to commencing school next year.
