

Student Success: Part 6 "Attendance"

This week we continue to breakdown the 7 aspects that achieve student success. This week we focus on Attendance. It has been proven that lack of attendance at school impacts a student's performance and education. Therefore, it is simple – the more you are at school, the greater the chance for success. It is important to note that meeting course requirements (especially in senior years) is not only about marks and results. There are three components to meeting course requirements: results, outcomes and hours. A student's attendance at school ensures they are meeting the hours required to complete courses.

Remote Learning Feedback and Update

Secondary Staff and Students are settling in remote learning. Majority of students are engaged and are communicating with their teachers. The use of Microsoft Teams to collaborate is being received well by staff and students which provides us the peace of mind that our transition to this platform by term 4 will be a successful process. As mentioned, our aim is to transition to Microsoft Teams for all courses to replace Moodle. This transition has been impacted by our current pandemic crisis, however, our goal will remain to make a full transition by term 4 for all courses and become the main and only platform for online learning.

I do need to remind you that students must be engaged in their education during remote learning. Remote learning is not a holiday or a term break.

Students are expected to continue their learning journey until the end of the term. Daily messages are being emailed to students which includes a prayer, announcements and reminders.

Remote Counselling Services

Our College continues to be committed to the mental health and wellbeing of our students. Now more than ever, the wellbeing of our students is of great concern. The College has discussed the provision of remote counselling procedures and would like to inform you that our College Psychologist will continue to provide counselling and support services to students even as we begin our time with students and staff working from home. The method of delivering counselling will change. Due to remote learning and the ongoing restrictions placed upon us, face to face counselling is not possible at this time. Our Psychologist will be using a combination of email contact, phone or online counselling sessions. Students who are already receiving counselling will be able to email the College Psychologist directly and request a session. The student has the option of requesting a phone session or an online session. Online sessions will be provided via Zoom (a video conferencing program). Relevant consent forms and information will be emailed to the student prior to the session. If a new student would like to request counselling, then they are able to email their Year Advisor who can arrange a referral to the College Psychologist. If parents have any concerns about their child, please contact the College directly.

Maintaining Hygiene and Safety at the College

All staff are continuing to emphasise the importance of hygiene at the College. They are continuing to provide sanitisers for students and are reminding them to maintain correct hygiene procedures. The College has implemented a more frequent cleaning schedule throughout the day and after school hours. We have also ensured we adhere to the social distancing requirements within the classrooms for those students who have continued to attend the College this week.



Year 7, 2021 Enrolments

Please note commencing Term 2, we will be commencing the

enrolment process for our Year 7, 2021 cohort. At this stage, we will not be conducting the face-to-face interviews. The enrolment packages will be arranged to be distributed to parents/guardians of year 6. The documentation will need to be completed and returned. Interviews will then be arranged later in the year when we are able to conduct these.
















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
