
guidelines.


#### **Kindergarten Writers**

Kindergarten students are continuing to produce outstanding pieces of writing. They love to use their imagination and incorporate new words they have learnt into their sentences. The students are always so proud of their efforts and will read their stories to anyone who asks.

#### Year 3 Mathematics

During Mathematics this week, Year 3 students were learning all about length. They became familiar with the different metric units of millimetres, centimetres and metres. Students enjoyed completing hands-on tasks that involved using a variety tools to measure lengths and distances.







#### Year 5 Music

Year 5 are currently learning about musical concepts. Students were asked to create a composition using their knowledge of notes, beats and bars. Groups presented their musical arrangement to their peers using percussion instruments. Fun was had by all!





#### **Learning Centre News**

Student borrowing resumed on Monday. Please ensure that your child has returned any books that they may have at home. We also remind all students to bring their library bag so that they can borrow new books each week.

#### **Attendance**

A reminder that College attendance procedures have now returned to normal. All students absent from school are asked to bring in a letter of explanation upon their return. Detailed documentation will be required for prolonged absence. We also ask that students who present with flu-like symptoms remain at home. Any students showing signs of sickness or become ill during the day, will be sent home.

#### **Communication with Teachers**

Just a reminder that all communication with teachers is to be conducted via phone or email through the Primary Office. Alternatively, you can write a brief note for your child to pass on to their teacher. This will ensure that any queries or concerns can be addressed promptly. In line with new health and safety procedures, we also ask you not to communicate with teachers at the end of the day as students are dismissed.

#### **Dismissal**

Students from Kindergarten to Year 2 will continue to be dismissed at staggered times starting from 3:00 pm. Parents are asked to leave the playground and area in front of the College, immediately after dismissal.

#### Homework

The Reading Eggs and Maths Online programs were implemented this week. As mentioned, these online programs replace the current format of homework across Kindergarten to Year 6. This means that Moodle will no longer be used for the delivery of homework activities.

#### **Traffic**

As more students are being driven to and from school each day, traffic during peaks times has significantly increased. We ask all parents to remain patient during these times. Extra staff are on hand at the end of the day to assist with the flow of cars around the pick-up zone.

#### Safety and Wellbeing

The safety and wellbeing of all members in our community is of great importance. When driving I urge everyone to comply with the road rules, especially within the school zone. As all students return to school next week, it is imperative that we are all more observant of the rules and their surroundings whilst driving. This will assist in maintaining a high level of safety for all in our community, especially our students.

#### **School Uniform**

A reminder to all families that students must wear their **full winter uniform** to school each day. All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles that comply with school expectations. Boys hair must be kept short without excessive hair product used. For girls, long hair must be tied back using appropriate hair accessories. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn. Students are to wear our school hat when outside. Please ensure that all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name and class. This makes for the easy return of items if they are misplaced. If for some reason your child cannot be in correct uniform, we ask that a note of explanation is sent to the class teacher. I thank you in advance for your cooperation.

#### Applications for Approved Leave – Travel

Just a reminder that currently, the following applies to all MCHF families.

- Applications submitted for leave to travel, will not be accepted.
- Any family returning from an overseas trip MUST SELF ISOLATE for 14 days prior to returning to College.
   Medical documentation must be provided before returning to the College.

#### **Return to Full-Time Schooling**

This week we officially welcomed back our students full-time. On Monday morning, we celebrated their return with decorations and an official red carpet for our students. The reaction and excitement of our students brought so much joy and reminded me why I chose the vocation to be in education. We pray that we can get through the current pandemic soon and return to our normal lives at the College and in our homes.





A reminder of the following changes that are currently in place until further notice:

- Thursday bell times will be the same as Monday-Wednesday and Friday.
- Thursday sport is now a pastoral session for students in Years 7-10. Year 11 continue with normal class and Year 12 continue with normal study.
- No excursions, incursions or camps will take place.
- Assemblies will not be held (unless required to address critical information).

#### **Visible Learning Update**

The College is continuing with working on improving our teaching and learning focusing on visible learning. We are currently gathering evidence on how visible learning is working at the College. This week focus group sessions occurred with selected students to provide their feedback on their learning experiences. Learning walks also occurred this week to gather evidence on the teaching and learning environment in classes.



#### Semester 1 Exams

Year 7 and 8 students completed their half-yearly exams online this week. Again, the process and transition to online exams was successful and students were able to complete their exams to the best of their ability. Next week, Year 9 students will complete their half-yearly exams. We wish year 9 all the best in their exams.

#### **Semester 1 Reports**

Year 7-11 Semester 1 reports will be issued as normal. However, the reports will be released on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July 2020 (Term 3, Week 1).

#### **Parent-Teacher Interviews**

The end of term Year 7-10 Parent-Teacher interviews will continue, however, the method of the interviews will change due to COVID-19. We are currently assessing the best method for the interviews. We will provide an update soon.

#### **Year 5 and 6 Transition to Secondary Sessions**

This term our Year 5 and 6 students will participate in transition to secondary sessions to prepare them for secondary education.


- Year 5 students will spend half experiencing life in secondary education. Each year 5 class will have a scheduled ate to participate in this session. Year 5 Rainbow will have their session on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> June 2020 and Year 5 Opal on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2020. The other Year 5 classes will have their sessions in term 3.
- Year 6 students will participate in their next session on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2020. Their session will be led by our Director of Curriculum and our Director of Pastoral Care presenting information on the secondary curriculum and pastoral care.

#### Year 7, 2021 Enrolments

Year 6 parents/guardians should have received now the Year 7, 2021 application package. Parents/Guardians are required to complete all the documentation and return them to the College. Completed and signed documents and the enrolment fees must be submitted and finalised in order for the enrolment to be confirmed. The forms are now due to be returned. Interviews will be scheduled later in the year.







Students in Kindy Rose were working with Fractions and writing sentences about their findings.
