




Kindy White join together in prayer for Lebanon. Please remember to continue to pray for Lebanon and give when you can.

Ms Dasouqi's Year 6 Topaz students learned about 3D shapes in Maths ☺



Police have been requested to patrol this area after a community complaint was received regarding illegal parking in front of the College.



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
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






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
