Changes to Uniform and Grooming Policy

The College has updated its policy on uniform and grooming for secondary students. Please note the main changes:

- 24 hours will only be provided for addressing uniform or grooming concerns.
- The College may immediately send students home pending on the issue.
- Arrangements will be made in consultation with parents/guardians regarding students with shaving concerns.

Therefore, please note that commencing Monday 9th November 2020, the College will be placing a high emphasis on uniform and grooming and addressing secondary students and parents/guardians if the uniform and grooming code is not adhered to.

The College requests the support of parents/guardians in administering the College Uniform and Grooming code. This can be achieved by ensuring that students are correctly dressed and groomed when leaving for school in the morning. If there is a reason that a student is unable to wear correct uniform, a signed note must be provided, indicating the nature of the issue and when the situation is likely to be remedied.




