



Year One - Godly Play

In Term 2, Years 9 and 10 will use the grass area at recess and lunch and Years 7 and 8 will use the B/C Block yard.


Year 8 Science

Ms Tleige's Year 8 science class performed an 'Expansion and contraction' experiment using a Bunsen burner, metal ball and ring. Students demonstrate the thermal expansion and contraction of metals when heated and cooled. When the ball is cold it can easily go through the ring and when heated up, it will expand and not go through the ring. Students applied this classroom learning to a real-world problem by discussing the factors engineers would need to consider in making their designs of buildings, bridges, and machinery.

The night will include a presentation by the Secondary Leadership Team and the chance to speak to the current Year 7 staff and students. 


