COVID Guidelines

The following COVID guidelines are effective as of first day of Term 1, 2021:

- The College is a registered COVID Safe premises.
- Parents/Guardians can enter the College grounds for one of the following reasons:
 - Purchase items (i.e. books or uniform) or make payments
 - Drop off students in Kindergarten, Years 1, 2 and 7
 - Attend Parent Orientation meetings for Kindergarten or Year 7 and 'meet the teacher' meetings with staff for all year/stage groups.
- Attend meetings with staff with an appointment only. All parents/guardians, guests and visitors must <u>sign</u> in using the QR Code when entering the College grounds and a <u>mask must be worn</u> when on College grounds. All meetings will be limited with to 1 hour where possible. A COVID-19 Safety Plan must be in place.
- Parent Association Meetings can proceed on College grounds after school hours.
- Water bubblers will be reconnected. However, we still encourage students to bring their own water bottles.
- All students over the age of 12 are required to wear a Mask when travelling on public transport (or chartered/private transport) to and from the College.

We request and appreciate your cooperation as we play our part to ensure our College remains a COVID Safe premises.

College Uniform

SECONDARY NEWS

On behalf of the Secondary staff, I welcome all students back to the College for 2021. My name is Erin McCluskey and I am the new Head of Secondary at Maronite College of the Holy Family. I would like to express my sincere gratitude to everyone who has made me feel so welcome since I have arrived, and I look forward to meeting and getting to know all of our families over the year.

On Friday 29th January we welcomed Year 7 for their Induction Day with our Year 10 Peer Support Leaders. Students got to meet their homeroom teachers and Year Advisor, Ms Hadchiti, and were given the opportunity to settle in and get to know the Secondary school before the rest of the students returned.



On Monday 1st February we welcomed back the rest of the Secondary school and held our first

assembly in almost a year. In my address to students, I spoke about our focus for the year; presentation, behaviour and academic excellence.

The expectations around behaviour, uniform and grooming were outlined to all students. This year, we will be placing an emphasis on these expectations and ensuring students present themselves in a professional manner. *Please see, below, a summary of the 'Student Uniform and Grooming Policy'*.

'We are what we repeatedly do, therefore excellence is not an act, but a habit'.

Developing good habits is a key to success. Students were asked to raise the bar they need to reach this year and believe that they can reach it as the only way to achieve more is to expect more. They were asked to set goals for themselves to work towards and to work hard to achieve them. We are raising the standards and I am confident that each student will be able to achieve their own success this year.



Student Uniform and Grooming Policy (Secondary)

Updated 4/11/202

Hairstyles and Grooming

All students are expected to observe the fundamental standards of personal cleanliness and hygiene necessary to promote good health and well-being.

Boys

Boys are expected to keep their hair well-groomed and clean at all times. Haircuts, which by their style or length draw attention to themselves as being out of the ordinary is not permitted. Appropriate haircuts are professional, blended, short and neat. The cut must not have any steps, shaved lines, razors on skin or reach the eye brows. *Any student with such a haircut will be directed to fix the problem within 24 hours, otherwise, they will be sent home to until the problem is rectified.*

- The only jewellery permitted for boys is a suitable watch and a religious cross on small chain
- No ear rings or rings are permitted
- No bracelets are permitted (religious bracelets is permitted, but not recommended)
- Boys must be clean-shaven every day; no facial hair or sideburns are permitted. Students who come unshaven to the College will be contacted by the College for an arrangement to be made to rectify the issue such as providing permission to shave at the College or sending home to shave.
- No eyebrow slits are permitted
- Tattoos of any size or shape are not permitted
- Excessive use of hair gel is not permitted
- Use of Antiperspirant roll on deodorants is permitted and recommended

Girls

Girls hairstyles must be neat, clean and tidy. Hair should only be of a natural colour. Cuts and management of hair needs to suit the uniform and be appropriate for College appearance. Girls with long hair (shoulder length and longer) are to tie it back with royal-blue or black ribbon or hair-ties. Girls with short hair are to ensure hair is tied up off the face. No hair extensions allowed. *Any student which does not meet these requirements will be directed to fix the problem within 24 hours.*

The College limits the amount and type of jewellery students can wear because jewellery can put a student's safety at risk when the student is participating in certain sporting, science or technology activities.

A watch is allowed as well as a cross on a necklace chain

- Girls are allowed to wear only ONE PAIR of simple ear stud or sleepers in the centre of the ear lobe. No additional piercings or additional clear earrings are permitted.
- No nose rings permitted
- No rings, bracelets or anklets are permitted (religious bracelets is permitted, but not recommended)
- No make-up, nail polish or artificial nails are to be worn
- Tattoos of any size or shape are not permitted
- Use of Antiperspirant roll on deodorants is permitted and recommended

Unacceptable items, if worn, will be confiscated by the teacher. They will be kept in the College Office for safe keeping and returned to the student at the discretion of the Director of Pastoral Care or Year Advisor. Homeroom Teachers will conduct uniform and grooming inspections every morning and offenders will be reported to their Year Advisor for follow up. College staff will continue to monitor student uniform and grooming throughout the day, including recess and lunch.

The College requests the support of parents/guardians in administering the College Uniform and Grooming code. This can be achieved by ensuring that students are correctly dressed and groomed when leaving for school in the morning. If there is a reason that a student is unable to wear correct uniform, a signed note must be provided, indicating the nature of the issue and when the situation is likely to be remedied. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to contact the Year Advisor at any time with concerns or questions regarding the uniform or grooming standards. Disciplinary action is taken against students who are out of uniform on a consistent basis.

College Bag

The approved Maronite College of the Holy Family bag is the only bag permitted and can be purchased from the College. It is to be kept in good condition with no stickers attached, or graffiti displayed. It should be clearly labelled with the student's name and address. No other bag of any type is permitted to be brought to the College.

Students in Years 11-12 must wear the correct sports uniform, including the College tracksuit, when they participate in sporting activities. This may include the College Senior personalised Jersey/Jacket.

Impetigo (School Sores)

Recently an outbreak of Impetigo (School Sores) has been discovered at the College. Students with the following symptoms should seek medical attention.

- The first symptoms can include areas of the body blistered or crusted. Blistering Impetigo may rapidly grow in size and number. Crusted Impetigo usually grows slowly and are always smaller than the fully developed spots of blistering impetigo.
- In cases where a larger area of skin is affected, a person can develop a fever, swollen lymph nodes or feel generally unwell.

If you find signs of *Impetigo (School sores)*, please seek medical attention from your family doctor and avoid contact with other people. Impetigo is usually spread through direct contact with other infected people.

Students with Impetigo are to ensure that the sores are kept clean and covered with a waterproof dressing. Hands should be washed thoroughly with soap and water for 10-15 seconds after sores are touched or redressed.

Students with Impetigo who cannot have their wound covered should be kept at home until 24 hours after the antibiotic treatment has been started or until the blisters have dried out if antibiotics are not used. Please refer to the Fact Sheet for more information.
