PRIMARY NEWS

As parents, we understand the importance of assisting our children in developing good reading habits. We become very good at identifying letters, recognising names, and reading words in our surrounding environment. We point these out every day as we go for a walk, drive in the car, or even watch television. With such an emphasis on reading, we can sometimes forget about the importance that Mathematics plays in our daily lives. Using everyday situations to highlight the importance of maths and the way we use it during activities such as cooking, shopping, and playing will allow our child to make real life connections to the mathematical concepts taught in the classroom. Simple activities such as asking your child to count the cutlery at mealtime can help them gain an understanding of doubling numbers and counting in multiples. Counting the number of steps it takes for each family member to walk to the letterbox and back again will allow you to discuss why the answer might be different for each person. Developing their estimation skills by asking them to guess what the answer might be and explain how they decided upon it is also a vital skill to possess.

Mathematical Fun

At school, teachers use a hands-on approach to allow students to consolidate their knowledge and apply new skills to a variety of situations. This week, students from 4 Amber and 4 Olive took their learning outdoors. Their task was to select an appropriate device to assist in the measurement of different areas around the school. Students had to apply a variety of mathematical skills including estimating and reasoning, to complete the task. Activities such as these, allow our students to transfer their knowledge into real life situations and understand the purpose of their learning.



Kindergarten have been learning all about two dimensional shapes. They were engaged as they worked in groups to examine and describe the properties of different 2D shapes. The fun really began when the students were asked to create 'Shape Monsters' using sticks and marshmallows. They then used their creative skills to produce a 'Monster' artwork. Such a great way to learn.

On Tuesday, 5 Rainbow and 5 Sapphire listened to Sr Marlene share her knowledge and wisdom about the Rosary. They learnt about the true meaning of the prayer and the important role it plays in our lives as Maronite Catholics. Students then joined Sr Marlene in praying the Rosary. First Aid Program

School Uniform
