This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the 350 Martyred Monks of St Maroun.

Feast of the 350 Martyred Monks of St Maroun - 31st July

After St Maroun died, many were inspired by his teachings and his ascetic way of life. By the fifth century, a monastery was built near where he lived known as Bet Maroun. The monastery became very significant in the region. Also in the fifth century, a debate had emerged about the nature of Jesus. The debate centred on whether Jesus was divine, human or both and exactly what that meant. Some, like the Nestorians, argued that Jesus was separately divine and human and that the two natures were independent. Others such as the Jacobites taught that Jesus was only divine and his divinity absorbed his human nature.

In 451, The Council of Chalcedon dealt with the debate once and for all, declaring that Christ was both divine and human, but one person.

The Maronite's upheld the proclamation of the Council of Chalcedon. The monks of Saint Maroun led the way, preaching the true doctrine and opposing heresy. We learn of the martyrdom of the 350 Monks in a letter from the monks to Pope Hormisdas in the year 517. They described the suffering and attacks they are enduring, particularly from the Antiochian Patriarchs Severus and Peter who opposed the teachings of the Council of Chalcedon. They described that they were mocked for their support of the Council and were suffering afflictions. They described how the Emperor Anastasius had sent an army that had marched through the district of Apamea, closing monasteries and expelling the monks. Some monks had been beaten and others had been thrown into prison. While on their way to St. Simon Stylite, the Maronite's had been ambushed and 350 monks were killed, even though some of them had taken refuge at the altar. The monastery was burned. The letter was signed by Alexander, priest and archimandrite, and over 200 other signatures followed of other archimandrites, priests and deacons.

We pray that like the 350 Martyrs, we are always obedient to the teachings of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

COVID AND REMOTE LEARNING UPDATES

We would like to thank you for the amazing work you have done with your child/ren over the past three weeks to ensure their learning and education can continue and not be severely impacted by the current and evolving situation. We also would like to acknowledge the support and cooperation we have received from you. Please be assured that we are working extremely hard to not only ensure we continue with delivering your child/ren their education, however, we are continually looking at ways to improve our online teaching and learning experiences.

Extension of Remote Learning

As you are aware, the current lockdown and restrictions have extended for another 4 weeks until 28th August 2021. Therefore, the current arrangements with remote learning will continue for this duration of the extension.



Supervision of Students

The College is now in a locked down Local Government Area (LGA). Therefore, the College will only be open strictly for those parents who are essential workers and cannot remain at home with their child/ren. Otherwise, you are required to keep your child/ren at home. Please note the College can only provide limited supervision, which will be carried out by both teaching and support staff.

Return of Year 12 Students and HSC Trials

As announced, Year 12 students will return to face-to-face teaching from Monday 16th August 2021. The Trial HSC Exams will commence in this week from Wednesday 18th August 2021 until Wednesday 1st September 2021. Further information regarding the HSC Trials will be provided once the College receives further advice and instruction.

Primary Students Live Lessons

Following the successful commencement of the morning daily check ins, our primary students will be commencing with daily live lessons in addition to the morning daily check in. These lessons will be scheduled for in the day at different times for grades to allow for students in the same household with limited devices to have the opportunity to join.

These lessons will commence on Monday 2nd August 2021. Further information and details will be communicated shortly.

Wearing Masks

As directed by the NSW Premier, all staff and secondary students who attend the College for supervision during Remote Learning are required to wear a mask. Staff are required to wear masks at all times and students are required to wear masks indoors only.

QR Code

Please note that it is mandatory for everyone (with the exception of students) to sign in to the College using the QR Code.

Accessing and Contacting the College

A reminder that no parent/guardian is permitted to enter the College grounds. Drop off in the morning and pick up in the afternoons must be done at the entrance gates.

The only exception for a parent/guardian to enter the College grounds is for essential business. Access will only be permitted to the Main Administration Office.

We ask that all other enquiries be made by phone or email.

Your continued support and cooperation in this matter is much appreciated. We pray that you all remain safe

during this time and we request you adhere to the current restrictions so that we can return to face-to-face teaching and learning soon.

SECONDARY NEWS

Year 10 Immunisations

The Year 10 Immunisations scheduled for this coming Monday 2nd August will be rescheduled to a later date. As soon as we have any more information, we will communicate this with our families.

Year 12 CSSA Trials Exams

After the announcement on Wednesday regarding the return of Year 12 on the 16thAugust, CSSA have moved their trial exams back to commence on Wednesday 18thAugust. As a result of this, the College's plan for Year 12 is as follows:

- Monday 16th August and Tuesday 17th August Year 12 will be at home using these two days as study days.
- From Wednesday 18th August, Year 12 will return to school for their exams only as per a normal exam block. They will come in for their exam and then go home.
- As soon as we have the updated CSSA exam timetable available it will be sent to all students.
- Strict COVID protocols as advised by the Government will be in place including 1.5m social distancing, the wearing of masks and temperature checks for all students. We are seeking further clarification on rapid antigen testing and will provide an update as soon as we have it.

HSC Exams Update

Some important updates from NESA regarding the HSC Practical and Written Exams:

- The oral language exams have been rescheduled to run from 14 August to 18 September.
- The hand in dates for all <u>major projects</u> have been extended by two weeks. The hand in date for Industrial Technology has been extended by four weeks.
- The <u>drama performance exams</u> have been rescheduled to run from **6 to 17 September**.
- The <u>dance performance exams</u> have been rescheduled. The new dates are:
 - 9 13 August for students outside Greater Sydney.
 - **13 17 September** for students in Greater Sydney.
- The written exams have been rescheduled to begin one week later on 19 October.
- HSC results will be released on 17 December.
- The music performance exams will continue as scheduled, running from **30 August to 10 September**.

The revised timetables for practical, performance and written exams will be published on the NESA website and in Students Online by this **Friday 30 July**.

Secondary Remote Learning

A reminder that all students are to be up, dressed, have had breakfast and at a desk or table ready to begin the school day by 8:40am each day when homeroom commences. Homeroom is where the official roll for the day is taken and any important information is passed on to students, so it is compulsory that all students attend. It is also a chance for homeroom teachers to check in with their students and make sure everything is going well, these daily catch ups set the scene for a positive day of learning ahead.

This week we have more of what has been happening in some our Key Learning Areas throughout remote learning.

CREATIVE AND PERFORMING ARTS (CAPA)

Visual Arts:

Year 7 Visual Arts students have been completing Visual Arts syllabus theory and writing up notes on mask making in preparation to their next unit of work. Most of the students have been actively engaged online and are working well.

Year 9 and 10 Visual Arts students missed an opportunity to visit the AGNSW to see the Archibald Prize. This week they will be given a chance to see it virtually online and are to complete a worksheet.

Year 11 Visual Arts students have been preparing preliminary sketches for their next unit of work, along with writing up a case study on Andy Warhol. Here are some examples of the ideas completed: - *Ms Sarlog*

Drama:

Stage 5 Drama have been learning about the theatrical styles of Commedia Dell'Arte and Realism during remote learning. Drama is a very challenging subject to teach remotely as it is heavily practical. We are now engaging in getting the theory work done and watching lots of examples of this style of acting. I suggest that Drama students ensure they complete all the set theory work and use this time to develop an excellent understanding of the set content. Students are responding well and looking forward to returning to the College so we can dive in to all the fun, practical activities!

Stage 6 Drama have been polishing their drama essay skills in the lead up to the Trials. They are using this time to revise the information needed to complete excellent essays! Year 12 have also been onsite at the College occasionally to work on their Group Performance and Monologues. The HSC Drama Practical Exam is fast approaching, and it is important we stay on track to ensure the performances we deliver are excellent! I commend my students on their resilience and ability to tackle any task given to them without complaint. - Mrs Youssef

Music

<u>HSC Music</u> students (pictured below) are practicing well towards their last performance ever! They have been given Wednesdays to come in and show me what they have been preparing. Also, every Friday they have been asked to send me video or audio of them practicing.

<u>Preliminary Music</u> is enduring extensive aural lessons in preparation for their end of year exam. Analysing excerpts using the concepts of music can be difficult but we are taking one step at a time and have been on TEAMS discussing responses and proper layout of questions. They have been promised prac when we return.

<u>9 Music</u> have been introduced to their new topic, JAZZ. They have been introduced to the concepts of music and using it to help analyse jazz songs. They have been given a prac journal to log in any time they spend towards their assessment for this term - performance of a jazz piece. They have been researching jazz musicians and trying to find a song to perform.

<u>8 Music</u> have been introduced to the construction of music and the importance of planning and structure for composition. They have been working towards their online program - Mighty Maestro, in which will guide them in their assessment - using the pentatonic scale to compose music. They will soon register for Noteflight to accomplish their assessment.

On the whole, students have been engaged well with remote learning in Music. Using Teams, students have been able to complete classwork through Forms, online discussions and worksheet submissions as well as undertake activities using online programs such as Mighty Maestro and Noteflight.

Technology And Applied Sciences (TAS)

The TAS students (7-12) have been progressing well with their learning. Majority of our students are logging in online for their virtual classes on time.

Practical demonstrations have occurred with Year 10 Food Technology where students watched a live demonstration of a popular homemade food product being made (Protein Balls). Then students were given a chance to make their own.

Year 9 and 10 Industrial Technology, Timber students have started extremely well under these testing circumstances and are making great strides towards completing their theory work for the year.

Year 11 Multimedia have been working on a group project using break out rooms in Teams to complete group work.

Ways to improve learning at home in the TAS learning area, commit to your online classes on time, adopt a healthy diet and sleep schedule. Change your learning environment (Avoid staying in PJ's all day and login for your learning in a designated study room).

Our Year 9 and 10 Industrial Technology, Timber students were encouraged to utilise their practical knowledge that they have gained to assist parents in any potential restorative works around the home. They were also encouraged, should they have the means, to think, develop and construct innovative projects out of wood that can be used at home.

Year 7 are learning about engineers and their contribution to society, whilst year 8 are refreshing their skills and knowledge about safety in the Timber room.

Year 9 Food Technology are learning about nutritional food and its availability around us. They are using their practical skills to help prepare meals at home.


Year 10 Food Technology are delving into the world of Food Product Development....


