The Sisters are also active in parish life and in pastoral care. We have ministries across Lebanon, Syria, Australia and the USA.


We ask you to keep us in your prayers, this Sunday, that we may continue to be faithful to God's call to serve.

St. Joseph's life was a continual process of waiting on the Lord's revelation to him. He had to wait for the Lord to reveal what Mary's pregnancy was all about, and what his role was to be. When Jesus was an infant, St. Joseph had to take his family and uproot them to Egypt to flee Herod's murderous threat (Matthew 2:13-23). In Egypt, he would have had to find new work and new shelter for his family, and stay indefinitely in a foreign land. But Joseph was patient. Joseph trusted in God's providential care for him.



After Mathematics, all the children were off ready to participate in their own Olympic games. Well done to all our little champions!






Then it was of course time to relax at the online Pool Party. What a fun way to learn!
