
# **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

## **MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL**

#### Welcome to Term 4

Welcome to Term 4 and I hope you have had a great break over the past two weeks resting and refreshing from what sure was a challenging Term 3. Term 4 is sure to be an exciting term as we continue in our learning journey for the last term of the year and welcoming back students from remote learning. I wish you all the very best for this term and I look forward to accompanying your child in their learning journey.

### **Return to School Road Map**

The College is looking forward to welcoming back students to the College and reverting to face-toface teaching. Below are the dates students will be returning:

- Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2021 Kindy and Year 1
- Monday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2021 Year 2-9 and 11
- Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021 Year 10

The College's return to school road map is in line with the NSW Government's announcement except for Year 10. Year 10 will return a week later as they complete their online yearly examinations from 18th October 2021 until 29th October 2021. The College will release further information next week.



### Uniform and Grooming

This term, students are required to be in their summer uniform. We also request from parents/guardians to pay close attention from now to their child's grooming to ensure they are prepared for their return back to school – this includes haircuts and shaving.

### Vaccinations for Students Aged 12-15 years

NSW Health strongly urges all students aged 12-15 years to receive two doses of either Pfizer of Moderna COVID-19 vaccines as soon as possible. There is currently sufficient supply of the Moderna vaccine to community pharmacies and the Pfizer vaccine to General Practitioners. Bookings can be made via the <u>Vaccine Clinic Finder</u>. Depending on location, bookings are available within the next few days. COVID-19 vaccination is the best protection against severe illness and also reduces the risk of spreading COVID-19 to others. Getting vaccinated against COVID-19 now will help to protect both you, your family and your school community. The following factsheets regarding Moderna and young people are available:

### Year 12 HSC Lectures

In week 4, from Monday 25<sup>th</sup> October to Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October, Year 12 students will be returning to school for compulsory HSC lectures run by their teachers. Students will need to be in full summer school uniform and normal grooming rules apply.

A detailed timetable with instructions has been emailed to Year 12 students already. Some important points to note about these lectures:

- These classes will take place in the old C Block across the road (where the HSC will also be conducted).
- The building will be deep cleaned, and the classrooms set up with desks and chairs ready to go.
- Year 12 students will not be allowed to cross over to the main College grounds except for an allocated time to clear out their lockers.
- Teachers will communicate with students as to what they would like them to bring to their lectures.
- Students are required to wear a mask and sanitize their hands before entering the classrooms (we will provide sanitizer outside each classroom).
- Students are to remain in the old C Block yard with Mrs Delimitros in between lectures.
- Students are asked to bring their lunch with them as they will not be allowed to leave in between lectures.

#### K-6 Return to School



### Student Attendance

A reminder that any student who does not complete their assigned work during Remote Learning will be marked absent for that day. Parents/Guardians must notify their child's class teacher of the absence and specify the reason for non-attendance. More detailed documentation such as a doctor's certificate with the student's name, needs to be submitted for prolonged absence. This procedure is mandated by the government.


