MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Unfortunately, this week didn't commence as we had hoped with the College being made aware of a positive COVID case of a Secondary student. Case interviews and contact tracing took place, resulting in our Secondary department reverting to remote learning.

As mentioned in my communication to the staff, students and parents/guardians, we are guided by the directives and advice of NSW Health and Catholic Schools NSW. This process is not a simple one and there are many tasks that needs to be completed during this process. However, I assure you all that the College will not put the health and safety of anyone at risk. We are here to ensure the safety of everyone at the College.

During this time, I request and appreciate that the decisions made are respected and not questioned. We acknowledge and appreciate that there is an element of concern during this time, which everyone has a right to feel. However, as mentioned, we are guided by directives from other external agencies which we implement. We cannot go against the advice of NSW Health and Catholic Schools NSW.

We will endeavour to communicate any necessary information to you, as soon as it is made available. We need to understand that this may not be the only time we are in this situation, as we may likely have other situations in the future. However, we will continue to follow the same process and be guided by authorities.

I thank NSW Health and Catholic Schools NSW, who were very supportive during this process. Finally, I wish to remind all parents/guardians to please be vigilant with your children and look out for any symptoms and get tested. Please keep your children at home if they develop any symptoms. This is our best safeguard against this virus.

On a lighter note, today we celebrated Mass to induct the New College Leaders for 2022. I would like to congratulate them and wish them all the best in their roles for 2022. Following the Mass, the Year 3 students had their First Reconciliation. Hoping the Holy Spirit guides their every move and remains in their hearts always.

SECONDARY NEWS



Students will need to arrive 30 minutes prior to the exam start time to complete the COVID check in and screening questions. Students must adhere to the College uniform and grooming expectations and must be in full summer school uniform. Kindergarten

Kindergarten students are currently learning all about living things. Over the coming weeks, each class will be focusing on the characteristics, basic needs, behaviours, and the environment of mealworms. The students can't wait to see the mealworms metamorphize into beetles!



In Mathematics this week, Kindergarten Red have been learning all about creating equal groups. They worked in pairs using concrete materials to make and draw equal groups. The students even calculated the total using different mathematical strategies such as counting by 2's, 5's, and 10's.

Communication with Teachers

Now that all students have returned to full time faceface teaching, we ask that all communication is conducted via phone or email to the Primary Office. Alternatively, you can write a brief note for your child to pass on to their teacher. This will ensure that any queries or concerns can be addressed promptly. In line with new health and safety procedures, we also



remind you not to communicate with teachers or other staff members at the end of the day as students are dismissed.

Library Borrowing

A reminder that library borrowing has now ceased for the year. We ask that students return any College library books they may have at home so that the end-of-year procedures can begin in the Learning Centre. This will ensure that all the books are back on the shelves and ready for borrowing at the start of the 2022 school year.

Uniform

As we approach the end of the year, it is important that students continue to comply with uniform expectations.

This also includes having appropriate haircuts and wearing suitable accessories. We would appreciate parent assistance in ensuring that the College Policy is always adhered to by your child. If you have good reason why your child is not in correct uniform, we kindly ask that a note be written and sent to the class teacher.

School Bus

In recent weeks, there have been increasing reports of poor behaviour on the buses travelling to and from school each day. Please remind your child that correct behaviour is always expected, especially when wearing the College uniform. All students must continue to abide by College rules and expectations until they arrive home. Disrespectful and inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated, and consequences will be given to students if necessary.

Attendance

A reminder that College attendance procedures have now returned to normal. All students absent from school are asked to bring in a letter of explanation upon their return. Detailed documentation will be required for prolonged absence. We also ask that students who present with flu-like symptoms remain at home. Any students showing signs of sickness or become ill during the day, will be sent home.

Partial Absences

Regular absences, whether for the whole day or part of the day have a detrimental effect on your child's academic progress. We understand that at times appointments for a specialist and the like are unavoidable, but these need to be planned and if possible, should occur outside of school hours. Collecting students early from school for reasons such as avoiding traffic, is not permissible. Prior approval will be needed for any parent wanting to collect their child after 2 pm.
