
Year 12 2022 Hospitality Class

NSW Health Priority Testing for HSC Students/Close Contact Information

The NSW Government released information earlier this week to say that COVID-19 test results for HSC students will be prioritised by NSW Health to minimise any impact on HSC exams.

If an HSC student is required to get a COVID Test, they are advised to inform their GP/or clinic that they are currently doing their HSC so their test results can be prioritised.

NSW Health advice is that if a person lives with a close contact they do not need to self-isolate. This means that HSC students who have a family member or person living with them identified as a close contact will be able to sit their exams with minimal interruption.

People who live with a close contact should minimise contact with them as much as possible during their period. This includes:

- staying and sleeping in a separate room
- using a separate bathroom if available, and cleaning all surfaces after each use
- not being in the same room as the close contact
- not sharing household items such as dishes, cups, towels, and bedding. These items should be washed thoroughly after use.

Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day in Australia commemorates the sacrifices of men and women during times of war. Yesterday, teachers and students commemorated this day with a special ceremony held in individual classrooms. It was dedicated to all those who had fought for our country to protect it from harm. Students reflected on the significance of this day by remembering all the men and women of the Australian Defence Force who made the ultimate sacrifice for the freedom we share today. *We will remember them.*

Social Media

The use of Social Media and online safety has been discussed many times throughout the year. As we approach the longest break of the school year, I thought it would be timely to remind parents of the dangers associated with the online world. Technology is often an easy way to occupy a restless or bored child at home, but it is essential that all children are closely monitored when using any device, especially phones and iPads. This includes online games that children play, especially ones that involve interaction with others. Child safety whilst online and the effects the amount of screen time has on a child's wellbeing, are two important things to remember when allowing children to use technology.

The eSafety Commissioner recommends seven steps to assist children when entering the digital world so that any risk they may encounter can be minimised. These include:



- 1. Be involved
- 2. Work with your child to set boundaries for screen use
- 3. Be clear about the consequences of not switching off
- 4. Set device-free zones and times in the house
- 5. Ask your child to explain their screen use
- 6. Use tech tools to help manage access
- 7. Lead by example

Placing parental controls on any device children have access to, can significantly reduce the risk of them encountering inappropriate content when they are online. These controls are especially important for younger children. For further information, please visit www.esafety.gov.au/parents

This year our Stage 3 Maths Olympiad Team competed against more than 70,000 other students from 84 different schools across the state. Their combined Team Score enabled our College to be ranked in 8th position. All students are to be commended for their commitment and ongoing effort. I would also like to acknowledge Alexi Nasr, Joshua Ghabache, Jason Azar, and Roberto Tannous who were awarded top marks in their exam. A big thank you to Ms Suzy Lal who guided and supported our team throughout the year.

Communication with Teachers

Now that all students have returned to full time faceface teaching, we ask that all communication is conducted via phone or email to the Primary Office. Alternatively, you can write a brief note for your child to pass on to their teacher. This will ensure that any queries or concerns can be addressed promptly. In line with new health and safety procedures, we also remind you not to communicate with teachers or other staff members at the end of the day as students are dismissed.

Library Borrowing

A reminder that library borrowing has now ceased for the year. We ask that students return any College library books they may have at home so that the end-of-year procedures can begin in the Learning Centre. This will



ensure that all the books are back on the shelves and ready for borrowing at the start of the 2022 school year.

Uniform

As we approach the end of the year, it is important that students continue to comply with uniform expectations. This also includes having appropriate haircuts and wearing suitable accessories. We would appreciate parent

assistance in ensuring that the College Policy is always adhered to by your child. If you have good reason why your child is not in correct uniform, we kindly ask that a note be written and sent to the class teacher.

Attendance

A reminder that College attendance procedures have now returned to normal. All students absent from school are asked to bring in a letter of explanation upon their return. Detailed documentation will be required for prolonged absence. We also ask that students who present with flu-like symptoms remain at home. Any students showing signs of sickness or become ill during the day, will be sent home.

Partial Absences

Regular absences, whether for the whole day or part of the day have a detrimental effect on your child's academic progress. We understand that at times appointments for a specialist and the like are unavoidable, but these need to be planned and if possible, should occur outside of school hours. Collecting students early from school for reasons such as avoiding traffic, is not permissible. Prior approval will be needed for any parent wanting to collect their child after 2pm.


PARENT CORNER

Parramatta Light Rail would like to advise that there will be some traffic changes that will commence on George Street, Parramatta between Purchase and Alfred Streets. We understand that students come along this location to access the Maronite College of the Holy Family in Alice Street, Parramatta.

Road closures and traffic control will be in place from 22 November. There may be some temporary road closures, traffic diversions, traffic-controlled boom gates and you may experience some minor delays with access in this location.
