MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Close Contacts and Isolating

Over the past week or so, we have been advised that some members of our College community have been identified as close contacts and are required to self-isolate. Below is some information regarding close contacts that has been taken from NSW Health's website:

Close contacts

Self-isolation and testing requirements for close contacts are different based on vaccination status.

FULLY VACCINATED CLOSE CONTACT

2 doses completed at least 14 days before you last had contact with a COVID-19 case.

1. Self-isolate for 7 days

7 full 24-hour periods from the date you last had contact with the COVID-19 positive person. For example, if you last had contact with the positive person at 10am Tuesday, you must self-isolate until 10am the following Tuesday.

- 2. Get tested immediately, and again on day 6
- Leave self-isolation after 7 days
 You can leave self-isolation after 7 days if your test on day 6 is negative, you feel well and you have had no further contact with a COVID-19 positive person.
- 4. Limit activity for another week For the next 7 days, you must work from home where possible and not go to high risk settings (health care, aged care, disability care, early childhood centres, primary school and correctional facilities).
- 5. Get tested again on day 12.

If you live with a COVID-19 positive person and have not been isolating from them, you should only leave selfisolation after 14 days have passed from when the person received their positive result. To end isolation, you need to have a negative day 12 test, feel well, and have had no further contact with a COVID-19 positive person.

NOT FULLY VACCINATED CLOSE CONTACT

0 or 1 dose or 2 doses completed less than 14 days since you last had contact with a COVID-19 case.

- 1. Self-isolate for 14 days 14 full 24-hour periods from the date you last had contact with the COVID-19 positive person
- 2. Get tested immediately, on day 6 and again on day 12
- 3. Leave self-isolation

You can leave self-isolation after 14 days if your test on day 12 is negative, you feel well and you have had no further contact with a COVID-19 positive person.

Level 3 Guidelines and Restrictions

The College is now operating under Level 3 guidelines and restrictions. A summary of these guidelines has been published for our community on our College website and SkoolBag App. Parents/Guardians are strongly encouraged to take some time to read this document so that you are aware of the current guidelines and restrictions. We request for your cooperation and support with these guidelines and restrictions.

Year 9 Textiles (Photo below-left)


Year 9 Textiles Technology have been learning about fabric dyeing.

Illness/Misadventure Forms

Message from the Director of Curriculum:

When filling out an illness misadventure form for a missed assessment task for your child, please ensure that <u>all</u> sections are filled in correctly. Failure to fill in the application form correctly and provide the required evidence (e.g., medical certificate) will impact on the processing of the application. In addition, the application for illness misadventure must be made within the timeframe indicated in the form. Delayed receipt of applications may not be considered. If you are unsure of how to fill it in, please contact the relevant KLA Coordinator or the Director of Curriculum, Ms Dalla.

Uniform and Grooming

Just a reminder to all students that our College uniform and grooming policies remain in place for the entire term. Boys need to be cleanly shaven and have a blended haircut. Girls need to ensure hair is tied back and the only jewellery that can be worn is one set of earrings in the lower ear and a religious necklace or bracelet – no rings are to be worn. Fake nails and nail polish are also not allowed.

Students can only wear their sports uniform on days that they have practical Health lessons, and on Thursdays, students must wear their coloured house polo.

As the term draws to a close, I ask all students to continue to adhere to these rules.

We have a large number of students who still have overdue library books. We ask that any student who has not

Uniform

As we approach the end of the year, it is important that students continue to comply with uniform expectations. This also includes having appropriate haircuts and wearing suitable accessories. Girls must have their hair tied up if it is longer than shoulder length. They are to use hair ties and headbands that are either navy blue or yellow. No student is permitted to colour their hair. We would appreciate parent assistance in ensuring that the College Policy is always adhered to by your child. If you have good reason why your child is not in correct uniform, we kindly ask that a note be written and sent to the class teacher.

School Bus

All students must continue to abide by College rules and expectations until they arrive home. Mr Botros' Year 10 Food Technology class have been looking closely at Food Trends. This time, delving into the use of this popular ingredient "chia seeds", which was tied into the latest dessert trend of "dairy-free" / "vegan" style eating. The practical experience was welcomed with open arms, as most students tried chia seeds for the first time and realised they could easily swap "knefeh" for this delicious pudding every now and again!



Mango Chia Pudding Recipe

Preparation time: 5 minutesServes: 2Cooking time: 30 minutes or overnight

Ingredients:

- ¼ cup chia seeds
- 1 tablespoon maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup coconut milk
- ½ cup mango (fresh if in season or frozen)
- 1 tablespoon passionfruit (fresh or tinned)
- 1 tablespoon coconut flakes
- Mint leaves (optional)

Method:

- 1. Add the chia seeds, maple syrup, vanilla extract and coconut milk to a mixing bowl. Stir together.
- 2. Place in the fridge to set. It is ready in about 30 minutes, when a gel is formed and the mixture is thicker. Otherwise, refrigerate (covered) overnight.
- 3. Dice the mango and mash with a fork, or puree in a blender.
- 4. In a serving glass, layer the mango and chia pudding. Decorate with passionfruit and some toasted coconut flakes and/or a mint leaf.

PARENT CORNER

School Readiness Test 2021

In preparation for transition to NAPLAN Online in 2022, selected groups of students in Years *3, 5, 7 and 9* will be participating in the School Readiness Test (SRT) between 22nd -26th November 2021.

SRT is an opportunity for schools to set up and run simulated tests to become familiar with the online assessment platform and reflect on areas that may need to be addressed ahead of moving online. SRT is not an assessment of student ability. Student test attempts will not be marked, nor will results be available.


Parents/guardians of students who have been selected to participate in the SRT will be provided with further details next week.

Parramatta Light Rail would like to advise that there will be some traffic changes that will commence on George Street, Parramatta between Purchase and Alfred Streets.
