MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL – Sr Margaret Ghosn

Dear Staff, students and parents/guardians,

You would have noticed the very large number of students and staff who are absent due to Covid. Unfortunately, I have been informed there is a WhatsApp group where parents are encouraging one another not to tell the College if their child has covid because they will have to stay at home for a week with their siblings. This is very UNETHICAL behaviour and extremely disappointing. As a result of selfish actions, we now have far too many absences. Students are missing out on class and there are many days where due to teacher illness, the students are not receiving explicit teaching. The Government has clearly stated that if you have covid or are a close contact you must isolate for 7 days to reduce the rate of infection. Any parent that deliberately sends their child to College is behaving in an unacceptable manner that harms the rest of the community. Please avoid such behaviour and do the right thing for the sake of everyone.

On a more positive note, there have been some great events around the College including:

- New furniture (desks, chairs, and whiteboards) in Primary and Secondary classrooms at a cost of over \$25,000
- Primary students sat a Performance Assessment test so teachers can better understand where students learning is at and how to focus on better teaching interventions
- Secondary will sit the student performance assessment in term 2 so teachers will have data on how students are performing
- There will be a Problem-solving math focus for Primary students first week back of term 2
- Focus on English programming in Primary throughout term 2
- Public speaking competition to be held against St Maroun's College students next term



<u>Change to self-isolation requirements for close and household contacts who have recovered from COVID-19</u> Please note the changes to self-isolation requirements that are effective of this week:

If a person in your household tests positive to COVID-19, they must self-isolate away from everyone else in the house for 7 days from the date of their positive test. They must follow the advice for <u>people testing positive to</u> <u>COVID-19</u> which includes, how to self-isolate effectively. If the person is unable to safely self-isolate by themselves (e.g. due to their young age), a parent or carer should self-isolate with them.



- The entire household must also self-isolate for 7 days from the date of the positive person's test. They should follow the advice for <u>people exposed to COVID-19</u> and <u>take a test</u> as soon as possible, have another test on Day 6 and at any time COVID-19 symptoms appear.
- If another person in your household tests positive to COVID-19, that person must restart their 7 day selfisolation period from the date of their positive test, even if they don't have any symptoms.
- Other household members who test negative, do not need to re-start their 7 day self-isolation period. They also do not have to self-isolate again anytime in the following 14 days **unless they test positive**.
- People who test positive to COVID-19 and complete their 7-day self-isolation period **do not have to test or self**isolate as any type of contact for **12 weeks after their release**.
- Self-isolation means staying at home or at your accommodation. This means you cannot drive your children to school or day care; you must ask someone else to do this. You must only leave self-isolation to get medical care or in an emergency. For more information, read the <u>self-isolation rules</u>.

Please refer to the <u>NSW Government's COVID-19 pages</u> if you require any further information regarding testing and isolation requirements as this information can change.




Easter Craft in the Learning Centre!
